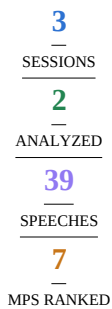

The National Assembly conducted a theoretical discussion on the Appropriation Bill, 2082 for the fiscal year 2082/083. Eight members from various parties discussed budget allocation, implementation challenges, fiscal discipline, and equity concerns. The session revealed mixed support for the budget—some praising its realistic approach and early implementation timeline (from Shravan), while others criticized inadequate resource allocation to marginalized communities, concerns about national debt, and questions about budget execution in local governments. The Finance Minister thanked all contributors for their substantive input.

Parliament's 18th session (Meeting 23) held on 12 Ashar 2082 (13 January 2026) covered three major agenda items: zero hour statements on urgent national issues, a question-answer session with the Ministry of Culture and Tourism on cultural heritage protection and minority language rights, and an extensive resolution debate on water and sanitation access. The resolution, introduced by Jag Prasad Sharma, proposed five specific policy demands including tax exemption for water systems, electricity subsidies, loan interest rate reductions, community participation mandates, and establishment of a domestic bleaching powder industry. The session demonstrated broad multi-party consensus on water security as a fundamental right, with extensive discussion of constitutional obligations, implementation challenges, climate change impacts, and health implications.

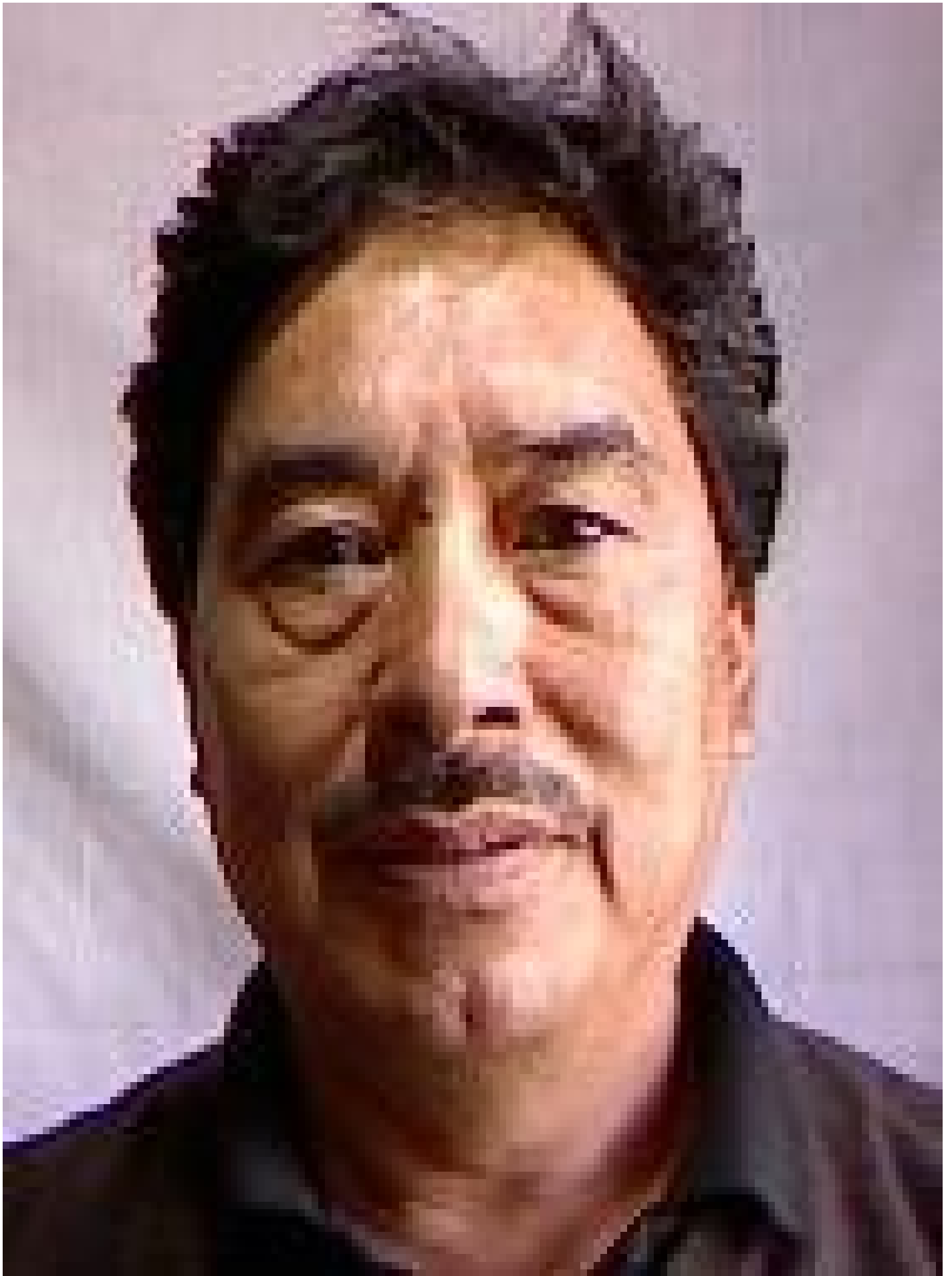

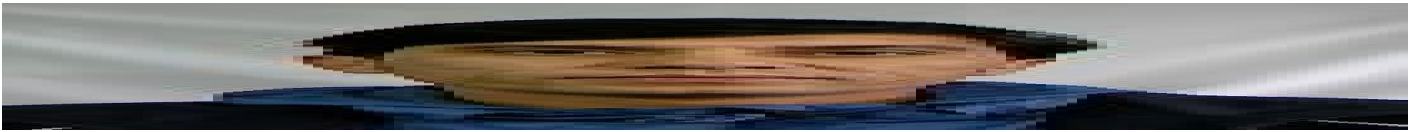
